#### Are You Ready for Christ's Return?

Happy New Year! But what in the world just happened? It seems like just a couple of weeks ago we were coming out of the summer and preparing to kick off our regular programming for the fall and here we are at the start of a brand New Year! I feel like I just entered some kind of crazy time hop. But before we put away all of the Christmas decorations and jump completely into the new, I want to take a moment to celebrate what happened in December. We were ushered into the Advent season on that first Sunday with our "Hanging of the Green" service. This is always a wonderful kick off to the Advent season and to help the sanctuary begin to take on the look and feel of Christmas. I want to say a special "thank you" to our Flower Committee and those who helped them and invested extra time making things so beautiful during this season. On the 8th, we were led in worship by our adult and children's handbell choirs as they played some beautiful and technical pieces to put us in the Christmas spirit. I thoroughly enjoyed the arrangement of *Joy to the World* that the adult handbell choir played! On the 15th, the adult Christmas choir, children's choir and musicians presented the Christmas cantata, Arrival, in the afternoon and evening and both services were absolutely beautiful! A special thanks to those who helped provide refreshments after the Hanging of the Green and choir presentations and to everyone who participated in the **Advent readings and candle lightings** each Sunday. Add to that our Christmas Eve service which is always a beautiful way to celebrate and remember Christ's birth and I would say it was a wonderful Advent season!

Are you ready for Christ's return? After all, the season of Advent is meant to help us focus on His return one day and hopefully to live better lives as we wait. I was reminded about Christ's return especially as I worked on our sermon series, "Unwrapping the Gifts of Christmas". As I was preparing for the week in which we focused on "joy," I came across some interesting information about the much beloved Christmas carol, Joy to the World! The Lord is Come. A young boy once complained to his father that most of the hymns they sang in church were boring to him, too far behind the times, tiresome tunes and meaningless words. Haven't I heard that before within the church over the years, especially my years in youth ministry? The young man's father put an end to his son's complaints by saying, "If you think you can write better hymns, then why don't you?" The boy went to his room and wrote his very first hymn, When I Survey the Wondrous Cross. The year was 1690, and that teenager was Isaac Watts. Watts went on to write somewhere between 600 to 750 songs to include Joy to the World! The Lord is Come. But did you know the song is actually based on Psalm 98:4-9 and Genesis 3, and was written to celebrate Christ's second coming much more than His first? The song speaks to Christ's return when He will rule in power, justice and mercy and that is what Advent is about as we wait and anticipate His coming again one day.

So, let me ask you again, are you ready for Christ's return or are you packing the meaning of Advent away with the rest of your Christmas decorations and just looking forward to a New Year? Did your season of Advent prepare you to live better in the coming year? Can you sing Joy to the World! The Lord is Come at the top of your lungs, or did it leave you busted and wondering how you will make it in the coming year? I am excited about 2025 and all that the Lord has in store for us individually and as a church. I'm longing to be a better person at the end of 2025 than I was at the end of 2024. How about you? What are you doing to have a better heart that prepares Him room as you wait to receive your King? What plans have you made to make space for the Savior to reign in your life this year? Have you considered how you will seek to grow in righteousness in 2025? Rather than packing Advent away for another eleven months, why not begin to make some personal plans to be better and continue to sing Joy to the World! The Lord is Come the entire year long.





#### Mill Creek's Gift to the Community for a Quarter Century ... Or MORE!

Like many traditions, the first year of Mill Creek's Christmas Bazaar is a bit unclear, but we do know that this event has taken place nearly every December for YEARS and YEARS! The proceeds from this event have been given to international and local missions and for several years a portion has helped to pay off our building fund debt. The Bazaar has grown over the years and now includes vendors, crafts, high quality "yard sale/White Elephant" items, gift baskets, photos with Santa, Santa's Workshop shopping for children, bake sale, breakfast and lunch. That first Saturday of December is a busy day filled with joy and excitement! However, to get to the joy and excitement of the day, LOTS OF BEHIND THE SCENE work takes place... sometimes MONTHS in advance! Many are busy with pricing our White Elephant donations, scheduling the photo shoot with Santa, enlisting the help of our church bakers, seeking those who will provide baskets filled with goodies for the raffle, collecting and displaying items for Santa's workshop, purchasing food for breakfast and lunch, advertising, setting up for the special day, and CLEANING UP! WHEW! It is a busy time of hard work for many, but it is such a sweet gift to our community!

#### For Some--- It's All About the Food! Breakfast, Lunch, and Bake Sale!

Some of the visitors to our Christmas Bazaar come just for the food! Breakfast is very popular and this year, 10 dozen eggs, 10 dozen biscuits, 7 pounds of sausage for gravy, 9 pounds of bacon, 4 gallons of juice and lots of pots of coffee were consumed. At lunchtime, 80 hot dogs were enjoyed! Our Mill Creek bakers had been busy the week of the bazaar and provided a wide array of baked goods! There were cakes and pies, candies and cookies, rolls and loaves of bread, brownies, homemade jellies and hot mustard and even a couple of gingerbread houses!

#### Gift Baskets



This is certainly a true statement when it comes to our bazaar's "yard sale". We accept Christmas decorations and donations of "nicer" household items that can be useful for gift giving or decorating for the holiday season. Storage space is very limited, so collection of

### Christmas Bazaar (continued) Santa Photos and Santa's Workshop



Visits by Santa to our Mill Creek Bazaar began 22 years ago as an opportunity to offer high quality free photos to community children along with the focus of telling them the true meaning of Christmas. This was before the widespread use of cell phones and easy access to taking photos. In those early days, 50 or more families enjoyed this opportunity to capture their children's visit with Santa and receive photos of that special visit. Over the years, the camera lens has seen the great excitement of children as they greet Santa with a smile. It has also witnessed the tears of some at the very sight of the jolly man in the red suit. Some of those children from the early days are now grown and married and they are returning to Mill Creek with children of their own for this special Christmas event. This year, 30 families enjoyed the opportunity to have photos taken with Santa. These families came from nearby and as far as Salem and Appomattox! There is no charge for this photo shoot, but a donation box is available.







Shortly after the Santa photo taking began, we started

looking for ways to enhance the children's experience as well as occupy them while they waited their turn before the camera. For a couple of years, craft projects were attempted and then the suggestion was made to have a place where kids could shop for gifts for their parents. This would be a hands-on way to teach children the joy of giving. Today, thanks to the many donations of new or nearly new items, gift bags, tissue paper, and ribbon, the tradition continues! This year a staff of around 9 volunteers helped the children pick out gifts – all by themselves! The young shoppers have so much fun choosing what they will give! Their gifts are then wrapped, tagged and bagged so that the receiver will be surprised Christmas morning... assuming that the excited child can keep the secret that long! Children who are prepared, pay \$1 for each gift. The initial focus was buying for parents, but thanks to many generous donations some also are able to shop for grandparents and siblings. One of our very first shoppers was a preschool aged child whose mother had recently been diagnosed with cancer. Now a teenager, he along with his mom and grandmother, still visit every year.

The week following the bazaar, Mill Creek Child Care kiddos get to shop for free. This is a very special ministry to our child care families. Here is one story that was shared by the staff.

\* One of the first years that our child care children shopped and wrapped their gifts, Mrs. Regina told of a mother who took the gift out of the child's cubby when she came to pick her up at the end of the day. The mother, upon the realization that the Christmas gift was for her and that her preschooler had chosen and wrapped it, began to cry. Through her tears she told Mrs. Regina how very much the gift meant to her on a day when she was completely depleted.

From our church and community, we have these stories regarding special gifts purchased from our Santa's Workshop:

- \* A grandmother relayed that for 8+ years, she has been drinking her morning coffee from a mug that her granddaughter excitedly gave her one Christmas morning.
- \* A church member with grown children shared that they still had a very "unusual" deer statue that their child had picked out in Santa's Workshop long ago. She said that the gift still makes her smile when she looks at it. This same Mom has volunteered in the Santa Shop.

Our Santa Photos and Santa Workshop provide memories that last for years!

It is guesstimated that about 35 people helped on the day of our 2024 Christmas Bazaar! There is no way to count the number of folks who donated for the White Elephant Sale and the Bake Sale. We are grateful for each of you!

How many community folks visited the Bazaar???? Maybe 200? There was a steady stream of visitors from early until late! Some have come every year. Some were new-timers. Some we see ONLY at the Bazaar! All were greeted with a display of red and green, Christmas decorations, the hustle and bustle of the season, and the warmth of our Mill Creek fellowship.

The Baptist Women's Night Group with the help of the Daytime Mission Group sponsor this event, but more help is needed. visited! Santa was here and lots of photos of happy children were taken. The children got to shop in Santa's workshop to purchase surprise gifts for their families and friends. The receipts are \$5,200 and this will be divided between the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering for International Missions and our church's building improvements. Many thanks go to all of you!



Drayer Blanket The Prayer Blanket team covets your prayers and is thankful for your support. As December is a time of reset and reflection, the team would like to recap the progress of this ministry for 2024, as well as remember our group mission projects. As of December 1, the Prayer Blanket Ministry Team has furnished approximately 172 blankets, as tangible reminders of Mill Creek's prayers. This includes our group mission projects, where 16 blankets were presented to Mill Creek Child Care students, and this fall 15 blankets were gifted to the Greater Outdoor Ministries Disabled Sportsmen. Also, 14

blankets have been sent to the North Carolina victims of Hurricane Helene. To be good stewards of the fabric, bought solely by donations, the team used scraps to make 6 baby blankets, 16 hats, and 14 scarves. For those into accounting, that breaks down to 15.6 blankets per month these past 11 months! Our team is small, but mighty, and we would welcome any newcomers to teach them how to square and tie blankets. When blankets are sent out, prayers are renewed and updated in the sanctuary by Pastor Danny. Blankets can also be prayed over in Sunday School classes. The success of this ministry would not be possible without Mill Creek's generosity and mission mindedness. 





who informed us that the electric workers were backing their truck up and making room for us to get in. There was no problem with the driver of the wrecker as he was able to come back later.


With help from the folks at the shelter, the unpacking of the bus began, and the gifts just kept coming out of that little bus. Seems as though



Virginia Mission The approximate cost is \$7 per bag. Please join in helping to provide these needed supplies to students in our own state.




#### Help with Processing Books for SW VA Needed

The books that are donated for BookNet will need to be processed for distribution and lots of steps are a part of this! Someone will need to look at each book and determine if the condition is good. Then labels are





\* The Mission of the Botetourt Resource Center, Inc. is to provide and connect needed human resources to the residents of Botetourt County through information, referral, advocacy and programs.

#### Botetourt Resource Center, Inc. "Together We Make a Difference" Accomplishments of the Botetourt Resource Center July 1, 2023-June 30, 2024

- \*\*\* During this 2023-2024 fiscal year, the BRC case-managed 200+ households in Botetourt County to respond to requests for assistance as information, advocacy, referral and services.
- 1. The BRC, Inc. was awarded \$29,455.00 from the Mary Louise Home Fund and \$11,070.00 from the Marion S. and Willie Z. Camp Fund for Eldercare through the Community Foundation Serving Western Virginia (CFSWVA) to support the Center's programs for older adults.
- 2. Fourteenth fiscal year for the only non-profit and county-wide crisis fuel fund in Botetourt County called the Botetourt Resource Center Interfaith Crisis Fund under the non-profit status of Mill Creek Baptist Church and in partnership with 25+ churches. Funds spent this year = \$3,417.87 on helping 34 households with fuel assistance and free firewood delivery to seniors. In addition to this assistance, 41 senior homes were helped with \$14,803.10 in fuel assistance from a CFSWVA Grant. Total fuel assistance through the BRC, Inc. = \$18,220.97.
- 3. Continued the first and only Senior Dental Assistance Project in Botetourt County to give <u>7 seniors</u> free cleanings, x-rays and extractions, fillings and resurfacing of teeth. This program was possible this fiscal year from the CFSWVA with funds of <u>\$3,030.15</u>. A total of <u>\$22,256.60</u> has helped <u>85 seniors</u> who otherwise could not afford dental services.
- 4. **Delivery of 20+ loads of Free firewood to 10 senior homes** through a partnership with Mill Creek Baptist Church "Woodcutter" volunteers throughout the fall and winter months.
- 5. Coordinated Thanksgiving and Christmas adoptions with local churches for 12 children and youth in 6 families to receive gifts and food; the BRC's Elves for Seniors Program provided Christmas gifts to 108 seniors living in Botetourt County.
- 6. In partnership with the Local Office on Aging (LOA), the BRC, Inc. received 65 Soup for Senior Bags in February 2024, which were distributed to older adults in northern Botetourt County. The BRC served as a distribution site for 30+ Seniors in Botetourt County to receive a monthly Food Box through Feeding Southwest VA Commodity Supplemental Food Program.
- 7. In June and July of 2024, the BRC partnered with Feeding Southwest VA to offer <u>Summer Food Boxes</u> through their <u>Summer Food Service Program (SFSP)</u>. The Center served <u>34 children</u> in <u>14 families</u>. The Center hopes to continue offering this program to help ensure children have access to nutritious meals over the summer.
- 8. The LEAP (Local Environmental Agriculture Project) Mobile Market (1st and 3rd Weds) offered farm fresh items for the public to purchase in both Eagle Rock and Buchanan; Feeding Southwest Virginia Mobile Market (4th Weds) also offered fresh items as well as canned food and non-perishables for purchase each month in Buchanan; 30-50 people served/month.
- 9. Recreation for Seniors = Beginning in January 2024, the Resource Center resumed weekly Senior Bingo activities, offering two separate Bingo groups every Thursday. An average of 12-15 seniors attended weekly activities at the Center. The BRC partnered with Solomon's Mission to offer a Senior Valentine's Day Luncheon in February Over 100 seniors attended; In April 2024 Solomon's Mission hosted a Senior Spring Fashion Show shopping at the Mission, lunch, various prize drawings and bingo were offered compliments of Solomon's, the Local Office on Aging and the BRC 30+ seniors attended.
- 10. Facilitated Basic Needs Assistance to Seniors through fuel/utility assistance, other bill assistance, home supplies, recreation, dental assistance, small home repairs, etc. (not including the value of free firewood, clothing and food) with <u>\$36,923.60</u> funds spent from a CFSWVA grant.
- 11. Disbursed \$50,354.31 in helping needy individuals and families in Botetourt County with basic needs/crisis assistance.
