Godly Touches

Here we go! As we begin this month of "Thanksgiving", I want to pause and express my personal gratitude to our Mill Creek family for the many ways in which you celebrated Debbie and me during "Pastor Appreciation" last month. From the personal well wishes, notes and cards to the various goodies and gifts and even a shout out in the Fincastle Herald, we felt very loved, appreciated, affirmed and encouraged! Thank you!

All of that made me think about the power of a "godly touch." Have you known it? Maybe it was a loved one who wiped away the tears and gave you a much-needed hug during a time of disappointment. Perhaps it was a hand holding yours in a time of grief or a note you received at just the right time. Even if you aren't physically touching others, maybe you're folding your hands to pray for those on our prayer list. You're using your hands to write notes, to make calls, send texts, to bake bread, cook a meal, or blessing others in some way. When we have experienced the power of a "godly touch," it typically causes us to want to do the same.

I recently had a phone conversation with a couple from Houston, TX who were doing a "fall foliage" camping trip and coming through our area. They called because they saw we are a collection site for "Flood Buckets", and they wanted to purchase items to drop off on their way past Mill Creek. They were the recipients of "godly touches" when Hurricane Harvey flooded their home in 2017, and now they want to offer the same "godly touches" to those who have experienced the devastation of recent flooding in our area.

Unlike our friends from Texas, sometimes we forget the touches we have received. Life gets busy and we forget how significant one touch can be. We fear saying the wrong thing or doing the wrong thing, and rather than make a mistake, we do nothing at all. Aren't you glad Jesus didn't forget? He touched the "untouchables" and the downcast of the world and He calls you and me to do the same by whatever means we are capable of.

November offers us a variety of ways in which we can give a "godly touch" to others. You can fill a bag with the needed items for the Fluvanna Correctional Center for Women and return them by Sunday, November 3. Judy Deel recently shared a testimony with me in which a woman who had been incarcerated in Fluvanna said, she was issued a bar of soap a week for bathing. When these bags came from strangers, it was like Christmas morning. Stamps and cards allowed her to reach out to family with a birthday note or Christmas card. Because of "godly touches" from others, she was able to offer "godly touches". We will continue to collect "Flood Buckets" through Sunday, November 10. Many of these will be a "godly touch" to flood victims in Damascus, VA. We have folks making Ditty Bags that will be filled with toiletry items and become a "godly touch" to school children in SWVA in March. We will have a church-wide packing party for Operation Christmas Child Shoeboxes on Sunday, November 10, which will allow you to extend some "godly touches" to other parts of the world. Our Outdoor Ministry is providing a "godly touch" to disabled sportsmen with the 20th anniversary of our deer hunt. You can offer "godly touches" to women and children in need by purchasing Christmas gifts for the shelter in Philadelphia that a group from Mill Creek will be delivering on December 7.

And with a major election happening this month let's not forget that "godly touches" can also happen by how we respond before and after "Election Tuesday". Sadly, it seems that each election year has only become more volatile, ugly and divisive. I have allowed my worry and angst surrounding this election to lead me to the throne of grace in prayer and I hope you will as well. Scripture reminds me that God can and will use whomever He chooses, however He chooses, whenever He chooses, to accomplish His perfect will in our lives and in this world He created. Whether your candidate wins or not, remember that God is still Sovereign and seated on His throne and He is calling us to share "godly touches" with others.

Caught in a Pickle

In the classic episode of "The Andy Griffith Show" called "The Pickle Story," we see a funny but important lesson about telling the truth. Aunt Bee is really proud of her homemade pickles and wants to share them with everyone. But when Andy and Barney taste the pickles, they don't like them at all. Instead of being honest with Aunt Bee, they tell little lies to avoid hurting her feelings. This leads to a lot of funny misunderstandings, but it also ends up hurting Aunt Bee when she finds out the truth.

This episode teaches us that being honest is very important. Even if it seems easier to tell a small lie to avoid hurting someone, lying can cause more problems later on.

The Bible tells us that telling the truth is very important. Proverbs 12:22 reminds us that God loves people who are honest. When we are truthful, we show others what God is like, because He is the ultimate source of truth (John 14:6). Jesus wants us to be honest in what we say and do because honesty helps us build trust and strong relationships.

Think about your recent conversations. Have you ever told a little lie to avoid hurting someone's feelings? Consider how being honest could have changed those situations. Just like Andy and Barney learned, lies can lead to more problems and hurt feelings. Remember, if you need to give someone feedback or share your thoughts, do it respectfully.

Dear God, thank You for being the source of all truth. Help us to be honest in our words and actions. Give us the courage to tell the truth, even when it's hard. May we be trustworthy in everything we do, and may our honesty bring glory to You. In Jesus' name, we pray, Amen.

Hurricane Helene Rug Makers

During Hurricane Helene, Beth and Steven Jewell welcomed six Appalachian Trail hikers to BeeCh Hill B&B/Hostel located on Valley Road. They were tired of hiking in the rain. For two hikers, this delay in their hiking plans became an introduction to crocheting rag rugs. Beth tells their story.

During this unexpected delay caused by Helene, our hikers quickly made connections with each other and enjoyed the camaraderie of hanging out in the dining room sharing stories about their adventures on the Appalachian Trail. As I had additional days off from work with schools being closed, I decided that I would tear the new sheet I had found at Goodwill into strips for a rug. I headed to the screen porch with my supplies. Rose was there using her phone so I just quietly ripped the sheet. When she hung up she shared that her "job in the real world" is that of an artist who creates with repurposed glass making stained glass





windows. She wanted to learn what I was doing and to try her hand at rag rugs. We sat on the porch and started a rug with no aspirations of her finishing said rug. Because it was damp and a bit cold she decided to take the rug into the dining room after all the strips were ripped. There Jesse watched for a while then Rose showed her how to make rugs. Jesse would use the crochet hook and Rose would hook on new strips. They spent all afternoon working on the rug. That evening when they all got back from dinner they decided they needed to work on the rug more as Rose was going to continue traveling south to complete her thru hike of the AT and Jesse was headed back on trail with her dad for another day of hiking. They stayed up late laughing and working on

the rug. The next morning Rose headed out and Jesse told her that she would get the rug finished before she and her dad headed back to Texas. And sure enough, they met their goal. Rose has finished her hike just outside of Pearisburg at Woods Hole Hostel and Jesse headed home by car after purchasing supplies to start making Christmas gifts for her family - rugs!

Rag rugs have been crocheted by our church family and friends for nearly 20 years. Hundreds of rugs have been made and have brought joy to many. Rag rugs have been given to family and friends and have been given as gifts on mission trips. The rug made by these AT hikers during Hurricane Helene will be taken to SW Virginia during our





"BookNet/Ditty Bag" mission trip in March and given to someone as a special gift. Our Rugging Ministry brings joy to both givers and receivers!



You are encouraged to start collecting items for your box. Also, consider writing a letter and have a photo to include in your packed box. This adds a personal family connection with the recipient of your box. Boxes are available at the front of the sanctuary and at the front of the fellowship hall starting in October.

Instructions for Packing a Shoebox

Make the decision of boy/girl, age of the child, purchase your items and pack your box. Each box needs a "wow" item such as a doll, soccer ball with a pump, or a stuffed animal. Other items can be toys, hygiene items, and school supplies.

DO NOT INCLUDE: candy; toothpaste; gum; used or damaged items; scary or war-related items; seeds; food; liquids or lotions; medications; vitamins; breakable items or glass containers; aerosol cans.

There is literature available at the entrance of the fellowship hall on "How to Pack a Shoebox." You can also go to the samaritanspurse.org/occ website for additional information.






